Prior to joining Leidos (formerly SAIC), Fratamico served as chief scientist at McDonnell Douglas Technologies Incorporated where he acquired a broad and deep technical foundation and a passion for applying cross disciplinary solutions to problems of national importance.

Fratamico earned his bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees in electrical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). During his tenure at MIT, he was selected as a Fellow of the Fannie and John Hertz Foundation. Within the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (San Diego Chapter), he has served as chairman of the Microwave Theory and Technique Society and the Antennas and Propagation Society.
