**VICE PRESIDENT LEIDOS UK & EUROPE AND
MANAGING DIRECTOR LCST**

Clark W. LeMasters is the Vice President and Managing Director for the Leidos UK Logistics Division, responsible for a £6.5Bn Logistics Commodities and Services Transformation (LCST) programme with the UK Ministry of Defence. He joined Leidos in June 2022.

A native of Ellerslie, Maryland Major General (Retired) LeMasters completed 34 years of service in the United States Army. His final assignment was the Commanding General, U.S. Army Tank, Automotive and Armament (TACOM) Life Cycle Management Command, responsible for a workforce of 19,000 military and civilian members worldwide. Clark delivered, synchronised and integrated the support across the U.S. Army, Joint services and through Foreign Military Sales programmes for over 500 critical Army major weapons and support systems. The TACOM team managed a supply chain for nearly 65% of all Army equipment which generated over 285,000 requisitions per year, for an inventory of over 46,700 Army managed Secondary items generating \$2Bn in sales supporting Army readiness. Additionally, TACOM managed the Non-Army Managed items retention program valued at over \$1.4Bn and critical organic industrial base operations across three Army Depots, two Arsenals and the Lima Tank plant with an annual operating budget of \$2.1Bn

His other General Officer assignments included Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Logistics G-3/4, U.S. Army Materiel Command; Commanding General of the 13th Sustainment Command (Expeditionary); Deputy Commander, Support Operations NATO Training Mission Afghanistan, and Chief of Ordnance and Commandant of the U.S. Army Ordnance School. He served overseas in Germany, Iraq, Qatar, and Afghanistan during his career. He holds an AS degree from Marion Military Institute, a BA degree in Chemistry from Frostburg State University, a MS degree in Systems Management from Florida Institute of Technology, and a Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) degree from the U.S. Army War College.

Clark lives in Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina. He is married and has two adult children, Lauren and Steven, with his wife Crickett. Clark enjoys the outdoors, fishing, gardening and working on cars.
