

Disabled Veterans' Scholarships Fund



Open University Disabled Veteran Scholarship Fund

The scholarship fund offers careers and disability wraparound support, with 261 people benefitting to date. 41% of the veterans have a physical disability, 24% have mental disabilities and 35% have a combination of both. 27% of the 261 veterans studied for a STEM degree/certification.

Leidos' sponsorship bolster the company's long history of supporting the military through logistics services, employment of veterans, community initiatives and supporting military sports.


Army Rugby Union

inHope. For those who need us most

inHope

inHope is a Bristol-based charity working in partnership with individuals, churches, community groups and companies to deliver the life-impacting work with homeless and vulnerable clients. inHope helps people overcome addiction and poor mental health, often caused by poor employment, discrimination and abuse.



Assisted Reading for Children

The mission of Assisted Reading for Children (ARCh) is to impart a love of reading to disadvantaged children in Oxfordshire, enhancing their lives and improving their life chances. Oxfordshire has almost 16,000 children living in poverty; 10 of its wards are listed in the top 25% most disadvantaged nationally. Leidos volunteer in local schools to support this programme.



Bristol Women's Voice

Since September 2022 to March 2023, we have delivered 20 activities for BWV, including 12 meetings with local communities, 6 workshops and 2 citywide events. An example of this was International Women's Day 2023, where 188 volunteers (both Leidos and BWV) worked for over 1700 hours to deliver the event. These initiatives support our local recruitment efforts as well as developing future diverse talent pipelines.



STEM Inspiration Awards winner

Leidos UK won the Inspirational STEM Employer Award 2022, demonstrating our commitment and efforts to supporting career pathways into tech for the next generation.



We Are BS15

The charity came about as a result of Covid, with the community pulling together to provide local support to the BS15 area to share food, skills, products and knowledge and, in turn, grow as a community in our shared resilience and compassion. Leidos staff have volunteered to create allotments and supported the building of a community kitchen which completed in June 2021.
