Our Government Affairs team works to promote our corporate congressional priorities through effective lobbying, relationship building and political engagement.

## **Trade Associations**

Pursuant to Section 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code, a trade association is an organization of companies and/or businesses that share a common business interest, does not engage in a regular business of a kind ordinarily carried on for profit, and is devoted to improving business conditions for Leidos and its peer companies in the industries and markets Leidos serves.

Leidos supports trade associations that advocate on behalf of our business interests and share our company's values of integrity, inclusion, innovation, agility, collaboration, and commitment. All proposed contributions and payments to trade associations are required to be in the best interests of the company, our customers, and our shareholders. Memberships in trade associations and other policy organizations or industry-specific groups must also be approved, in advance and in writing, by the Senior Vice President of Government Affairs. Our Government Affairs and Communications teams periodically review memberships in trade associations with annual dues and that engage in lobbying and policy advocacy activities, to ensure our goals and values align with these entities. The Corporate Governance and Ethics Committee of our Board of Directors, which consists solely of independent directors, is responsible for overseeing our political activity and contributions, including political expenditures to trade associations or other organizations, to identify and measure any risks associated with these memberships, including with respect to consistency with our business objectives and public policy priorities.
